BSA | The Software Alliance¹ supports a strong, national privacy framework that provides all consumers with meaningful rights over their personal data and ensures businesses are accountable for processing personal data in line with consumers' expectations. We commend your ongoing efforts to protect Floridians' consumer data privacy rights with SB1864 and would appreciate the opportunity to engage with your office again this session to share our perspective and recommendations to strengthen SB1864.

As you may be aware, BSA | The Software Alliance is the leading advocate for the global software industry domestically and globally. Our members are business-to-business companies that create the technology products and services that power other companies. They provide tools for businesses of all size including cloud storage services, customer relationship management software, human resources management programs, identity management services, and remote collaboration software. At the state level, we have advocated for strong privacy laws in a range of states, including Colorado and Virginia's recently enacted laws.
